

The First Reading

Acts 10:34-48

<sup>34</sup>Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup>but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup>As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), <sup>37</sup>you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup>And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, <sup>40</sup>but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, <sup>41</sup>not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup>And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup>To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

<sup>44</sup>While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. <sup>45</sup>And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. <sup>46</sup>For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, <sup>47</sup>"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" <sup>48</sup>And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. 


The Proclamation of Christ and the Lord's Prayer:



#### The Distribution of Holy Communion:

Lutherans believe that in this Sacrament the very Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ are present in, with, and under the physical elements of bread and wine. And this Sacrament is distributed to the Baptized of the Church who believe in the Presence of Christ in the Sacrament, sincerely repent of their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this Holy Meal. Those who are present at this celebration who are baptized, have been instructed in the meaning of this Supper, and believe likewise are welcome to commune with us at this Altar today.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation in a continuous manner in front of the altar. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. The Sacrament is distributed in the following way...Please extend your hand to the Pastor to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood is then received from individual cups from the assistant (wine and white grape juice are available). After receiving, please place your empty cup into the tray at the end of the communion rail and return to your seat by way of the side aisle. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing from the Pastor.



#### PREPARING FOR THE COMING WEEK ...

The Ascension of Our Lord (Observed), May 16, 2021 Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1-15-23; Luke 24:44-53 Sermon Text: John 17:11b-19





May 9, 2021

Dear Trinity Family,

In addressing you as family, that word embraces the idea for me that as Pastor and People we share our lives together, not only in the "spiritual" realm but also in what some may consider deeply personal moments. We have certainly "been there" for one another; bearing up one another with love in times both good and bad.

Some of you may (or may not) know that when I was born, I arrived into the world with a dislocated hip. I was "put back together" and spent the first couple of years in a half body cast, followed by another year of wearing a brace in which I even learned to walk. My parents were told that the ball of my hip was dead and that I would most likely need to have several hip surgeries through my teen years and into my early twenties. Because of the "active childhood of a young boy", the ball of my hip was found to have "come back to life", and the proposed surgeries were not seen to be necessary. The only thing that would be a part of my living would be a right leg slightly shorter than the other, giving me a limp.

Having reached my 50<sup>th</sup> year, it seems like age has caught up with my hip and it has become more and more arthritic, despite my own wanting it not to be (at least in my own mind, while my body has clearly told me otherwise), and some of you have even begun to notice that my walking with a limp has become a bit more pronounced. Finally listening to the advice of my dear wife, Kim, I recently went to see an Orthopedic surgeon at Mercy Hospital in Baltimore, who confirmed pretty much what I already knew and gave me the news which I sort of expected but which I did not want to believe as the solution to my problem—that I need to have a total replacement of my right hip.

So, what does this mean for me and for Trinity? My surgery has been scheduled for June 21st. I will be continuing with my "normal duties" until then, getting to celebrate with you all both Father's Day and my own 24th Ordination Anniversary on June 20th. The surgeon has told me that the recovery time for a hip replacement is twelve weeks. I have also learned that because of the type of surgery that I am having will require extra physical therapy which will take up six of those weeks. This is also the same amount of time for me to be restricted from driving because of the replaced hip being on my "driving leg". I have been advised that, while recovery from hip surgery is a process of returning to normal activities, I should consider that, at least, these first six weeks require me to be away from regular pastoral work, including Sunday mornings.

While it pains me (even more than my hip) to be away from Altar and Pulpit and all of you for that length of time, I do know that it is for the best. To that end, I will be making arrangements for this dear flock to be fed with Word and Sacrament on the Sundays I must be away, and to make provision for pastoral care should any emergencies arise during my recovery time. I will be working with the Ministry Planning Group in our best attempt to keep things "normal" during this time. We will keep you all informed of plans for this time as they get finalized, as well as any "changes of plan" as my recovery goes forward.

Knowing that I already have your support and love, I do covet your prayers for myself and for Kim as we go through another "medical journey" together, and prayers also for all of us as a Trinity Family that the Lord will indeed bring us all through this moment.
