






CONCERNING HOLY COMMUNION

Lutherans believe that in this Sacrament the very Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ are present in, with, and under the physical elements of bread and wine. And this Sacrament is distributed to the Baptized of the Church who believe in the Presence of Christ in the Sacrament, sincerely repent of their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this Holy Meal. Those who are present at this celebration who are baptized, have been instructed in the meaning of this Supper, and believe likewise are welcome to commune with us at this Altar today. Anyone who desires, child or adult, may come forward to receive a blessing.

Persons who have questions about what Lutherans believe or have any spiritual concerns are asked to speak with an Usher so that they can direct you to the Pastor so that you may speak with him before communing.


The Renewal of Baptismal Vows:

- Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into His death, and raised with Him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, now that our Lenten observance is ended, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in His Holy Christian Church.
- **P** I, therefore, ask you anew: Do you renounce the devil?
- C Yes, I renounce him.
- **P** Do you renounce all his works?
- **C** Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce all his ways?
- C Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?
- **C** Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?
- Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- **P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- Is it your earnest purpose to continue steadfast in this faith and in the promise of your Baptism and, as a member of the Church, to be diligent in the use of the Means of Grace and prayer?
- **C** Yes, with the help of God.
- The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen You with His grace to life everlasting.

 Peace be with you.
- C Amen.

The Prayer of the Church:

- In the Name of our risen Lord Jesus Christ, who has conquered death and the grave for all the world, let us pray for the Church and for all people according to their needs.
- P Gracious Father, in Your great compassion toward us, You accepted the sacrifice of Your dear Son, who gave Himself as our Substitute, suffering death on our behalf for our sin. In His glorious resurrection, You raised Him to life again; and by many proofs, He revealed Himself alive in the midst of His disciples, that we may know the favor You have for us through Him. By Your Word and Spirit, strengthen us in the true faith, that our trust in You and in Your mercy may be and remain lively and confident, and never be put to shame. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- Merciful God, through Your beloved Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, You won salvation for people of every nation, tribe, race, and language. Grant that the Easter Gospel of Your Son may have free course, that the Good News of Your salvation in Christ Jesus may be preached, heard, believed, and confessed throughout the earth. By Your mercy, send forth Your Holy Spirit, that all sinners may be brought to repentance and faith, refreshed in hope and love, delivered from death and the devil, and led into everlasting life and salvation; Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Ruler of all, bless the nations with justice and peace. In every government curb the evil of corruption and self-interest, and give leaders who will speak the truth and govern wisely. Where there is hatred, bring understanding; where there is war, bring peace. Help us all to set our minds on things above that, when Jesus comes again in glory, everyone may rejoice in His saving peace. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Lord Jesus, by Your resurrection from the dead, You give us hope and encouragement in the midst of physical suffering, for You have redeemed our bodies as well as our souls. Heal and strengthen those who suffer physical illnesses and conditions, especially _______. Give them patience and trust in Your mercy and providence. Use us to help alleviate their suffering by fulfilling our Christian vocation to love and serve our neighbor. Lord, in Your mercy,







The Words of Our Lord:



In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My He Blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."


The Proclamation of Christ and the Lord's Prayer:

- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

- P O Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, in giving us Your Body and Blood to eat and to drink, You lead us to remember and confess Your holy cross and passion, Your blessed death, Your rest in the tomb, Your resurrection from the dead, Your ascension into heaven, and Your coming for the final judgment. The Distribution of Holy Communion

Holy Communion is celebrated in this place in the joyful confidence that Jesus Christ Himself comes to us to give us in bread and wine His very Body and Blood to offer to us the forgiveness of sins. All Baptized Christians who have been instructed in the meaning of this Sacrament and confess with us Christ's Real Presence in this Holy Meal are welcome to commune with us at this Altar. A fuller explanation of what Lutherans believe concerning Holy Communion may be found on page one of this worship folder.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation at the chancel rail. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. You may kneel or stand as you feel comfortable. The Sacrament is distributed in the following manner...Please extend your hand to the assistant to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood may be received in one of three ways, using that which you feel most comfortable: 1) individual cups containing wine and white grape juice will be offered by the Pastor, 2) intinction: dipping the bread lightly into the chalice held by the Pastor, or 3) drinking from the chalice. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.








