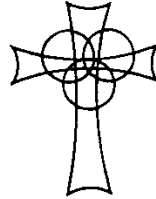

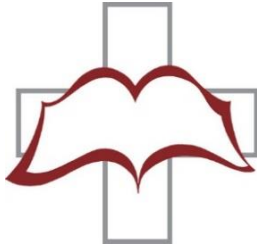
***WELCOME TO WORSHIP ONLINE!!!***

## The Order of Morning Service Without Communion

*Today's service may seem familiar to some as it follows the traditional outline of what was known to many as the "Page Five" service found in The Lutheran Hymnal. Because our worshipping online during this time prohibits us from our normal weekly celebration of Holy Communion, this seemed to be the most fitting order which allows us to follow our usual order of service that contains Confession and Forgiveness, Scripture, and Sermon, but without the celebration of the Service of the Sacrament.*

✠ **The Service of Baptismal Renewal and Prayer** ✠

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows:

- P** Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into His death, and raised with Him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, now that our Lenten observance is ended, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in His Holy Christian Church.
- P** I, therefore, ask you anew: Do you renounce the devil?  
**C** **Yes, I renounce him.**
- P** Do you renounce all his works?  
**C** **Yes, I renounce them.**
- P** Do you renounce all his ways?  
**C** **Yes, I renounce them.**
- P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?  
**C** **Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.**

- P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?
- C** **Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.**
- P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- C** **Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**
- P** Is it your earnest purpose to continue steadfast in this faith and in the promise of your Baptism and, as a member of the Church, to be diligent in the use of the Means of Grace and prayer?
- C** **Yes, with the help of God.**
- P** The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen You with His grace to life everlasting. ✠ Peace be with you.
- C** **Amen.**

#### The Prayer of the Church

- P** Rejoicing in the resurrection of our Lord and sharing in His peace, let us pray to the Lord on behalf of ourselves and all people as they have need.
- O risen Savior, set free our tongues to confess Your resurrection before a world still captive to sin and death. Give us courage to go to every place and to speak in every language the salvation won for us upon the cross and the hope granted to us of life that death cannot overcome. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P** O risen Savior, make us to burn with the fire of Your love, that we may love You above all things and love our neighbors as ourselves. Deliver us from fear and relieve the anxiety of our hearts, that we may live out fully the hope planted within us and the new lives we received in the waters of our Baptism. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, anoint the words of those who proclaim to us Your Gospel, and open our ears to hear with faith all that He has done to save us. Raise up many who will serve You in the various callings of Your Church and who will serve us in Your name with Your Word and gifts. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**



- P** O risen Savior, hear us on behalf of our president; our governor; the Congress of the United States; and all state and local elected officials. Guide them according to Your Word, that justice may be given to all and those most in danger may live freely and without fear of threat. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, hear us on behalf of those who cry to You in any need, especially the sick, the suffering, the disabled, the wounded in spirit, those who suffer mental illness and those in their last days on earth , especially\_\_\_\_\_. Give them grace according to their need, and sustain them in their afflictions to the day when their sufferings will be exchanged with glory in the life to come. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, hear us as we remember all those who rejoice in Your blessings to them, especially \_\_\_\_\_. As Your resurrection has restored life to us and to the whole world, may we always be filled with grateful hearts, always acknowledging You as the Giver of every good and perfect gift. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, hear us on behalf of all those who have asked for our prayers, especially as we remember before You \_\_\_\_\_, and all those whom we name from the silence of our hearts ... Receive all these prayers and petitions, and answer them at Your time and according to Your will. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, hear us as we remember all those who, having entered into eternal life, rejoice with us this day in Your resurrected presence. Console all those who mourn with the assurance of life that You give to all who believe in You, and encourage us by the lives of Your saints that we too may come to share at last the eternal joys of Your risen life. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** O risen Savior, before the words come to our lips, You know the desires of our heart. Hear our prayers as expressions of our trust that You supply us with all things needful and keep from us all things harmful. O crucified and risen Savior, with the Father and the Spirit You reign as one Lord and one God. Hear the prayers of Your people. Your will be done, O Lord, now and always.
- C** **Amen.**

*EASTER FELLOWSHIP* ... Even though we were unable to share fellowship today in our usual joyful sharing in breakfast, we did not want to let this special day pass us by without having a chance to "see" and greet one another and wish each other the joy of Easter. We have arranged for a meeting on Zoom that will start at 4:00 PM this afternoon, and we can see one another or at least hear from those who join us by phone. An email has already been sent out with the connection information. If you did not receive this information, please contact Pastor.

*ONLINE WORSHIP* ... As the State of Emergency with its limits on public gatherings continues, we will also continue our worshipping together online. Please join us on Facebook, or through the link available on the church webpage to help those who are not on Facebook to join us. Also on the church webpage, you will find a link to the current worship service bulletin which you can view or print to aid your participation in the service. We hope that this method of "gathering together" will work for us until we are able to meet with one another in our dear church home again. If there are any problems, comments, questions, or even complaints, please contact Pastor by phone or email and let us know what we can try to do to be better.

*OUR PRAYER LIST* ... The weekly "O Christ, Hear Us" page in the bulletin is a listing of those we remember in prayer during worship at Trinity and for whom you are invited to pray for in your own personal prayers during the week. During this time when we will be publishing our weekly bulletin online, we will only list the persons we are praying for by their first names because of privacy concerns and laws, while we may continue to lift them up by full name in our spoken prayers. Pastor will continue to keep the list current and invites you to send him by email any new prayer requests, or to let him know of any changes or deletions which need to be made. The "full text" version of the Prayer List, as it would ordinarily be found in the bulletin, can be made available to Trinity members who request one by sending an email to Pastor.

For those who are shut-in or who may be fearful of coming out in these days, please contact Pastor so we can have conversation together and—depending on health, conditions, and schedule—make arrangements to come and bring you Communion.

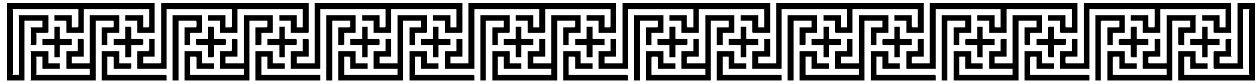
