The Scripture Reading for the Day

Ecclesiastes 12:1-14

¹Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come and the years draw near of which you will say, "I have no pleasure in them"; ²before the sun and the light and the moon and the stars are darkened and the clouds return after the rain, ³in the day when the keepers of the house tremble, and the strong men are bent, and the grinders cease because they are few, and those who look through the windows are dimmed, ⁴and the doors on the street are shut—when the sound of the grinding is low, and one rises up at the sound of a bird, and all the daughters of song are brought low—
⁵they are afraid also of what is high, and terrors are in the way; the almond tree blossoms, the grasshopper drags itself along, and desire fails, because man is going to his eternal home, and the mourners go about the streets— ⁶before the silver cord is snapped, or the golden bowl is broken, or the pitcher is shattered at the fountain, or the wheel broken at

the cistern, ⁷and the dust returns to the earth as it was, and the spirit returns to God who gave it. ⁸Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher; all is vanity.

⁹Besides being wise, the Preacher also taught the people knowledge, weighing and studying and arranging many proverbs with great care. ¹⁰The Preacher sought to find words of delight, and uprightly he wrote words of truth.

¹¹The words of the wise are like goads, and like nails firmly fixed are the collected sayings; they are given by one Shepherd. ¹²My son, beware of anything beyond these. Of making many books there is no end, and much study is a weariness of the flesh.

¹³The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. ¹⁴For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil.

1.	Why does Solomon advise his hearers to "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth" Why is this important in the light of what he describes in verses 1-7?
2.	How does our faith in Christ help us as we age and draw closer to our end? See what Paul says about this in 2 Corinthians 4:7-12.
3.	What does Solomon tell us his purpose was in writing the Book of Ecclesiastes? (verses 9-10)
4.	In what two ways are the God-given words of Ecclesiastes intended to help us? (verses 11-12a)
5.	What is Solomon speaking of when he says, "Much study is wearisome"? (verse 12b)
6.	In Solomon's closing words, what are we to learn and know about our life? (verses 13-14)

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
