The Scripture Reading

Matthew 2:1-12

¹Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

6""And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.""

⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." ⁹After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

The Scripture Study for the Day

Matthew 2:1-12

1.	The star the wise men saw was miraculous. It seems they saw it and then went in the general direction of Israel, stopping at Jerusalem to find specific directions. After they received specific directions, they again saw the star guiding them in a more specific direction. How are the following words are important for understanding this?
	• Bethlehem
	• what time
	• house
	• fell down and worship him
2.	In his genealogy of Jesus, Matthew singled out Rahab and Ruth as two of the women in the line of the Savior. They were both Gentiles, and the gospel was meant for them. How does the story of the wise men support this theme?
3.	God went to great lengths to bring the Magi to come and see the newborn King of the Jews. To what lengths has the Lord gone to bring you to the Savior?

Matthew 2:13-23

¹³When [the wise men] had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." ¹⁴And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt ¹⁵and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt I called my son."

¹⁶Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, became furious, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had ascertained from the wise men. ¹⁷Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah:

18"A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation,Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be comforted, because they are no more."

¹⁹But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, ²⁰saying, "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." ²¹And he rose and took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. ²²But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. ²³And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled: "He shall be called a Nazarene."

- 4. This section, with its account of the Holy Family's journey to Egypt, contains three more prophesies that Jesus fulfilled.
 - Hosea 11:1 (verse 15)
 - Jeremiah 31:15 (verse 18)
 - Matthew 2:23

- 5. How does this section of Scripture help us understand the nature of Jesus' ministry? How does it help us to understand the nature of the kingdom in which we live and serve?
- 6. There is more that follows the passage from Jeremiah which Matthew quotes. Jeremiah continues his prophesy, saying:

¹⁶ Thus says the LORD:

"Keep your voice from weeping,

and your eyes from tears,

for there is a reward for your work,

declares the LORD,

and they shall come back from the land of the enemy.

¹⁷ There is hope for your future,

declares the LORD,

and your children shall come back to their own country.

What comfort do these words provide?

- Prince of Peace, You bring reconciliation through the cross: by Your healing power give to all who suffer Your gift of wholeness and peace:
- **C** Lord, hear our prayer.

P Let us commend the world, to which Christ came, to the mercy and protection of God.

Open prayer may be offered and silence is kept.

- Rejoicing in the presence of God here among us, let us pray with confidence as our Savior Christ has taught us:
- Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

 O God, by the leading of a star You made known Your only-begotten Son to the Gentiles. Lead us, who know You by faith, to enjoy in heaven the fullness of Your divine presence; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

- O God, from whom come all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works, give to us, Your servants, that peace which the world cannot give, that our hearts may be set to obey Your commandments and also that we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may live in peace and quietness; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
