- As I mused, the fire burned; then I spoke with my tongue:
- 4"O LORD, make me know my end and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting I am!
- Behold, you have made my days a few handbreadths, and my lifetime is as nothing before you.
- Surely all mankind stands as a mere breath!

 ⁶Surely a man goes about as a shadow!
- Surely for nothing they are in turmoil; man heaps up wealth and does not know who will gather!
- 7"And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you.
- P 8Deliver me from all my transgressions.

 Do not make me the scorn of the fool!
- ⁹I am mute; I do not open my mouth, for it is you who have done it.
- P ¹⁰Remove your stroke from me; I am spent by the hostility of your hand.
- When you discipline a man with rebukes for sin,
- you consume like a moth what is dear to him; surely all mankind is a mere breath!
- 12"Hear my prayer, O LORD, and give ear to my cry; hold not your peace at my tears!
- For I am a sojourner with you, a guest, like all my fathers.
- ¹³Look away from me, that I may smile again, before I depart and am no more!"
- Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

¹Again I saw all the oppressions that are done under the sun. And behold, the tears of the oppressed, and they had no one to comfort them! On the side of their oppressors there was power, and there was no one to comfort them. ²And I thought the dead who are already dead more fortunate than the living who are still alive. ³But better than both is he who has not yet been and has not seen the evil deeds that are done under the sun.

⁴Then I saw that all toil and all skill in work come from a man's envy of his neighbor. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.

⁵The fool folds his hands and eats his own flesh.

⁶Better is a handful of quietness than two hands full of toil and a striving after wind.

⁷Again, I saw vanity under the sun: ⁸one person who has no other, either son or brother, yet there is no end to all his toil, and his eyes are never satisfied with riches, so that he never asks, "For whom am I toiling and depriving myself of pleasure?" This also is vanity and an unhappy business.

⁹Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. ¹⁰For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! ¹¹Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? ¹²And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

¹³Better was a poor and wise youth than an old and foolish king who no longer knew how to take advice. ¹⁴For he went from prison to the throne, though in his own kingdom he had been born poor. ¹⁵I saw all the living who move about under the sun, along with that youth who was to stand in the king's place. ¹⁶There was no end of all the people, all of whom he led. Yet those who come later will not rejoice in him. Surely this also is vanity and a striving after wind.
