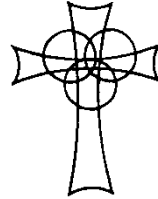

We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; <sup>9</sup>as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; <sup>10</sup>as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

<sup>11</sup>We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open. <sup>12</sup>You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. <sup>13</sup>In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.

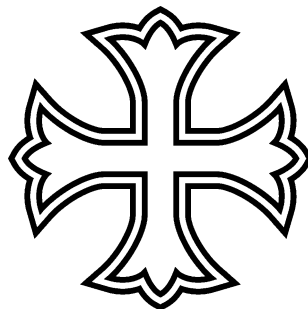
The Holy Gospel

Don't Worry, God's in Charge

The Prayer of the Church

- P** Our Help is in the Name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth, so let us pray to the Lord whom even the wind and waves obey.
- P** Let us pray for the Christian Church here and around the world, that she be preserved from false teachings and divisions; that she be granted faithful leaders, pastors and workers who serve joyfully; and that her members gratefully hear God's Word, respect the preachers He sends and gladly love all the people He places in our lives. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P** Let us pray for trust in the midst of troubles, that when the storms of life swirl around us and the events of life fill us with fear, we confidently rely on our God, know that He does care that we are perishing and live in peace because His mercy never fails. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P** Let us pray for forgiveness when we question God's ways, that our Father remind us that He—not we—laid the foundations of the world, and that He humble us and pardon our arrogance. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P** Let us pray for those who have been given positions of authority in our country, state and communities, that God provide them with wisdom for their work; that He lead them to defend the lives of those who are unborn or vulnerable; and that He use them to bring peace, justice and stability to our neighborhoods and world. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**

- P** Let us pray for police, fire, and rescue workers who care for us when we endure the storms of life, that our heavenly Father grant them protection from harm, that He provide strength and diligence to them in their work, and that He spare them from suffering as a result of the traumas they witness. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** Let us pray for all fathers, grandfathers, and father-figures for whom we give thanks today, that they cherish God's gift of children, willingly take responsibility for nurturing their families in the knowledge of Christ, and reflect our heavenly Father's love as they provide for those entrusted to their care. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** Let us pray for those who are experiencing life's winds and waves in sickness and sorrow, especially \_\_\_\_\_, that our Father calm their troubled hearts, carry them through their afflictions and grant them His peace. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P** Let us pray that those who rejoice in the rich blessings of God, especially \_\_\_\_\_, that they may always remember the Giver of every gift and give Him heartfelt thanks. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** Let us pray for all those who have committed themselves to our prayers, especially \_\_\_\_\_ and for all other things which are unspoken and hidden in our hearts..., that God who knows all and sees all would give His gracious and wise attention to our needs and desires, conforming all to His holy will. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** Let us pray for all who receive the Body and Blood of Christ, that this life-giving and sin-forgiving Food nourish our faith so that we calmly trust God through all the storms of life and eagerly care for others when the waves of trouble threaten them. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** Let us give thanks to the Lord for St. John the Baptist, the Prophet Jeremiah, and all those whom He has kept safe through the storms of this life and has led them in safety to the other shore and greater light of life eternal with the Lord. And we pray that the Lord would continue to give us faith to rest ourselves on Him and His care that we too may come to share in the joys of life in the Lord's presence forever. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C** **hear our prayer.**
- P** If He had not been on our side, the flood would have swept over us, but blessed be the Lord who has rescued us. 

The Distribution of Holy Communion:

*Lutherans believe that in this Sacrament the very Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ are present in, with, and under the physical elements of bread and wine. And this Sacrament is distributed to the Baptized of the Church who believe in the Presence of Christ in the Sacrament, sincerely repent of their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this Holy Meal. Those who are present at this celebration who are baptized, have been instructed in the meaning of this Supper, and believe likewise are welcome to commune with us at this Altar today.*

*Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation in a continuous manner in front of the altar. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. The Sacrament is distributed in the following way...Please extend your hand to the Pastor to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood is then received from individual cups from the assistant (wine and white grape juice are available). After receiving, please place your empty cup into the tray at the end of the communion rail and return to your seat by way of the side aisle. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing from the Pastor.*

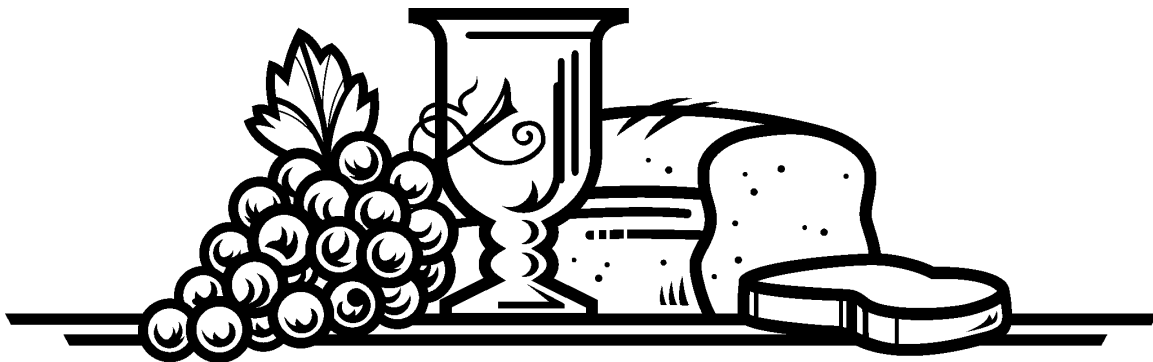

If you have donations, please contact Elma at the center before bringing your items during center hours.

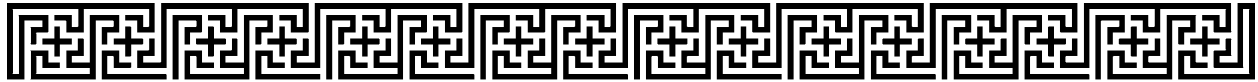
## **Trinity Stay-Safe Rules**
