The Sermon

Spirit, Spirit Everywhere

The Congregation rises.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows:

- P** Dear People of God: Our Lord Jesus Christ sealed the Paschal mystery of His Death and Resurrection in His ascension to heaven and in the giving of the gift of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. That same Spirit continues to grow the Church, giving it birth and new life in the waters of Holy Baptism. Rejoicing in the power that the Spirit works in and through God's chosen people, I call upon you, therefore, to renew the vows and promises of our Baptism.
- P** I, therefore, ask you anew: Do you renounce the devil?
C **Yes, I renounce him.**
- P** Do you renounce all his works?
C **Yes, I renounce them.**
- P** Do you renounce all his ways?
C **Yes, I renounce them.**
- P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?
C **Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.**
- P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?
C **Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.**
- P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
C **Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.**
- P** Is it your earnest purpose to continue steadfast in this faith and in the promise of your Baptism and, as a member of the Church, to be diligent in the use of the Means of Grace and prayer?
C **Yes, with the help of God.**

P The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen You with His grace to life everlasting. ✠ Peace be with you.

P O Lord, grant us this day the Spirit of our Lord Jesus Christ, that with faithful hearts and fervent faith we may approach the Feast of our Savior's Body and Blood, receiving from this Holy Meal the abundant gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation that were won for us by our Lord's life, death, and resurrection. Lord, in Your mercy,

C **hear our prayer.**

P O Lord of all, through Your Holy Spirit, You call all people to come to You, to trust in Your mercy, and to live by faith in Your promises. We give You thanks and praise for the Blessed Virgin Mary; Elizabeth, Zechariah, and John the Baptist; Justin and all of Your faithful ones who now dwell forever in the glories of heaven. Keep us also ever faithful to You so that we too may come to share in the joys of eternal life. Lord, in Your mercy,

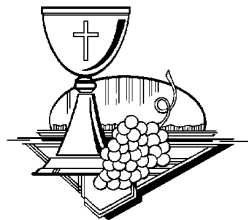

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: “Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My ✠ Blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.”

The Proclamation of Christ and the Lord’s Prayer:

P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord’s death until He comes.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation in a continuous manner in front of the altar. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. The Sacrament is distributed in the following way...Please extend your hand to the Pastor to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood is then received from individual cups from the assistant (wine and white grape juice are available). After receiving, please place your empty cup into the tray at the end of the communion rail and return to your seat by way of the side aisle. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing from the Pastor.
