





But the one who endures to the end will be saved."





Stand Firm!

Text: Mark 13:1-13

The Congregation rises.

The Nicene Creed:

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life 🕂 of the world to come. Amen.

- P Kind Father, Your Son revealed Himself to be the Good Shepherd who goes in search of the lost and straying. Keep us all under His protection, that we may not neglect to meet together, but gathering attentively around His Word and His Supper, be ourselves encouraged and encourage each other. Send us out to call back all who have erred and strayed from His ways. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P King of the nations, look in mercy on our country, our Congress and president, our judges and magistrates, and all those entrusted with civil authority among us. Make them to us a blessing of Yours. Take from them pride and contempt of Your Word, and fill them with wisdom, courage and integrity. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Holy One, the blood of Your Son gives us confidence to enter the holy places through the new and living way and to draw near to You with true hearts in the full assurance of faith. Hear us now as we offer our petitions before You for all who are in difficult and trying times, for those who are in prison, for the sick, for those who mourn, for the lonely and homebound. Especially ask You to remember _____. Grant to them all healing, peace, and comfort, according to Your gracious will. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Generous Lord, we thank You for all Your mercies to us, especially for our family and friends, and for Your continued blessing in our lives, including _____. We pray Your guidance throughout all our days, asking that You would, according to Your will, continue to show Your love and kindness to us and on those who are near and dear to us. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Compassionate God, You call us to find our rest and peace in You. We commend to Your wise and fatherly care ourselves, our prayers for ______, and all those who have committed themselves to our prayers whom we now name before You from the silence of our hearts ... Receive and hear all these prayers, and in Your mercy and love, grant them as may be best for us according to Your will. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Author and Giver of all good things, as we come to Your Son's table and feast together upon the Body and Blood that purchased the redemption of the world on the cross, prepare our hearts and minds to welcome with thanksgiving the signs and seal of His new and eternal covenant, that we might ever enjoy the forgiveness of sins and look forward to the day of the Savior's return. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.

- P O God, Fountain of life and immortality, to You we give thanks and praise for Elizabeth of Hungary, Clement of Rome, and all who have fallen asleep in Christ and await the joyful resurrection. The Distribution of Holy Communion


Holy Communion is celebrated in this place in the joyful confidence that Jesus Christ Himself comes to us to give us in bread and wine His very Body and Blood to offer to us the forgiveness of sins. All Baptized Christians who have been instructed in the meaning of this Sacrament and confess with us Christ's Real Presence in this Holy Meal are welcome to commune with us at this Altar. A fuller explanation of what Lutherans believe concerning Holy Communion may be found on page one of this worship folder.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation at the chancel rail. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. You may kneel or stand as you feel comfortable. The Sacrament is distributed in the following manner...Please extend your hand to the assistant to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood may be received in one of two ways, using that which you feel most comfortable: 1) individual cups containing wine and white grape juice will be offered by the Pastor, or 2) drinking from the chalice. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.






