The Sermon

Come See—Go Tell Text: Luke 2:1-20

The Congregation rises.



The Nicene Creed:

- I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.
 - And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.
 - And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life 🕂 of the world to come. Amen.

- Lord Christ, because of Your birth, we people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Fill us with joy this holy night as we celebrate that Your nativity, passion, and resurrection have lifted from us the burden of sin and broken the rod of Satan, our oppressor. Renew each of us in our baptismal faith so that we may love one another with the love You have shown to us. Send us Your Holy Spirit so that we renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives as we wait for Your return. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Lord Christ, as the shepherds spread the word concerning what had been told them about You, overcome our fears and open our mouths to all those we know how You came and gave Yourself to redeem us from our sins. Give godly fervor and pure teaching to missionaries, chaplains, pastors, teachers, and everyone You have called to proclaim Your Good News. Send Your Holy Spirit to bring unbelievers to repentance and faith, so that they, too, may rejoice in Your saving work. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.

- Lord Christ, You came to our world to be the Prince of Peace, bringing peace between humankind and God. Be with all the leaders of the nations that they may ever seek peace among each other. Help them to bring an end to war, violence, and terror, and help our world to see the day when the tools of war will be used as fuel for a fire of peace and justice. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- Lord Christ, You protected Joseph and Your mother Mary as they traveled before Your birth. Send Your angels now to watch over those who journey during this sacred season. Keep them safe, and provide for all their needs until they return home. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Lord Christ, protect those who protect us, especially those who must work on this holy night. Guard our police officers, firefighters, paramedics, doctors, nurses, and all emergency workers. Be with the members of our military, especially those who are spending Christmas apart from their families. Strengthen each of them for their tasks, and give them joy in knowing that as they serve us they are serving You. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Lord Christ, provide for those without homes or jobs or food or friends in this sacred season. Assure them that even when no one else seems to care, You will never abandon them. With the gifts You have given to us, use us to provide for everyone in need, so that through us, even those most destitute may experience Your providing care. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- Lord Christ, You came to save all people from their sins. Spare us also from the effects of our sins. Restore the health of all who are sick, injured, suffering, or recovering. Be with those who are lonely at Christmas or who feel like no one cares. Give us an awareness of their need and a willingness to help. Assure them of Your love and mercy, and give to them a confident trust that You are always with them. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P Lord Christ, Your coming brought comfort to a world that looked to You in hope. Be with all those who mourn in these Holy Days that they may know and feel the presence and comfort of Emmanuel, God with us. Lord, in Your mercy,

- Lord Christ, You listen always to the cries of Your people. Hear us now as we commend to Your compassionate care ourselves, our needs, and the concerns of all those who have committed themselves to our prayers, which we now name before You from the silence of our hearts... Receive all these petitions, and answer them all as may be best for us and according to Your gracious will. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P Lord Christ, as You once dwelt in a manger in order to save us, we rejoice that today You dwell in bread and wine with Your redeeming Body and Blood. As we come to Your Table, give us repentant hearts that want to change our sinful lives. Chase away our doubts, forgive our sins, renew our faith, and strengthen us by this Sacrament to live as Your children. Lord, in Your mercy,

- Lord Christ, Your birth has brought hope and joy to everyone who believes in You. The Distribution of Holy Communion

Holy Communion is celebrated in this place in the joyful confidence that Jesus Christ Himself comes to us to give us in bread and wine His very Body and Blood to offer to us the forgiveness of sins. All Baptized Christians who have been instructed in the meaning of this Sacrament and confess with us Christ's Real Presence in this Holy Meal are welcome to commune with us at this Altar. A fuller explanation of what Lutherans believe concerning Holy Communion may be found on page one of this worship folder.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation at the chancel rail. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. You may kneel or stand as you feel comfortable. The Sacrament is distributed in the following manner...Please extend your hand to the assistant to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood may be received in one of two ways, using that which you feel most comfortable: 1) individual cups containing wine and white grape juice will be offered by the Pastor, or 2) drinking from the chalice. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.






