



Anyone who desires, child or adult, may come forward to receive a blessing.







<sup>1</sup>Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear [Jesus]. <sup>2</sup>And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." <sup>3</sup>So he told them this parable: ...

"There was a man who had two sons. <sup>12</sup>And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. <sup>13</sup>Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. <sup>14</sup>And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. <sup>15</sup>So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. <sup>16</sup>And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.

17"But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! <sup>18</sup>I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. <sup>19</sup>I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants." <sup>20</sup>And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. <sup>21</sup>And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' <sup>22</sup>But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. <sup>23</sup>And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. <sup>24</sup>For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate.

<sup>25</sup>"Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. <sup>26</sup>And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. <sup>27</sup>And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.' <sup>28</sup>But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, <sup>29</sup>but he answered his father, 'Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. <sup>30</sup>But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!' <sup>31</sup>And he said to him,

'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. <sup>32</sup>It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."



A Prodigal Feast for Prodigals Text: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

The Congregation rises.

- E Kind and gracious Father, we are not worthy to be called Your children, and yet in love You have embraced us, named us Your own, and made us, by Your beloved Son, coheirs of all things. Remember all Your baptized children and stir up in them a desire for a life of communion with You. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.

- P Holy One, Your Son sends forth His messengers of reconciliation into all the world. Be present with all those who labor in Your Church as pastors, teachers, missionaries, deaconesses, and other ministers. Keep them faithful in their preaching, teaching, and administration of the Sacraments so that Your Church may be built up and strengthened. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Father of glory, kindly regard this family of Your people, that we might give a hearty welcome to all fellow sinners and assure them that they are wanted and loved in Your house. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Loving Lord, there is no sin that Your Son did not carry to death, no one for whom His sacrifice was not offered. Call those who have wandered from their baptismal birthright home to You and renew them by Your Spirit. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- Mighty King, Your Word commands us to pray for all those in authority in every place throughout the world. Remember especially in mercy our President, Congress and justices, and all who make, administer and judge our laws. Grant them to serve with integrity and wisdom. Into Your keeping we also commend all those who serve in our armed forces and in local emergency services. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P God our Healer, look with kindness on those who are taking treatments, those suffering from chronic illness or recovering from accidents, especially \_\_\_\_\_. May Your Son ever be their joy in sorrow; their health in sickness, and ever their peace, comfort, and hope. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- @ Generous Father, Your hand is open to bless us and to satisfy our desires. Be with \_\_\_\_\_ and all those who rejoice in Your mercy shown to them. Give all Your people glad hearts which realize Your goodness and that are moved always to praise You, the Giver of every good and perfect gift. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Comforting Father, You are present with us to give us Your gift of peace to those who grieve for those who have died, so they may not grieve as those who have no hope. Comfort (\_\_\_\_ and) all who mourn with the promises of Your presence now and a future reunion of all baptized believers in heaven. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.

- Loving Father, Your ears are ever open to the cries of Your children in their need. Hear the prayers of Your people offered to you for \_\_\_\_\_ and for all those whom we now name before You in the silence of our hearts... Listen, we pray, to all of these our petitions and grant them in love according to Your good and gracious will. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- P Bountiful Giver, Your Son has provided a feast for Your family where they taste Your love in the gift of His Body and His Blood. Give us penitent hearts to receive this most Holy Eucharist in firm faith, for our salvation and to our abundant blessing. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- P Great I Am, You are the Life that never ends and the Source of all that is. Receive our thanks and praise for the victory over death and the grave, which Your Son won for us. With joy we remember Joseph the Patriarch and all those who have departed this life in Your faith and friendship. Bring us with them to share the joys of Your eternal home. Lord, in Your mercy,



The Prayer of Thanksgiving and the Lord's Prayer:



# The Distribution of Holy Communion

Holy Communion is celebrated in this place in the joyful confidence that Jesus Christ Himself comes to us to give us in bread and wine His very Body and Blood to offer to us the forgiveness of sins. All Baptized Christians who have been instructed in the meaning of this Sacrament and confess with us Christ's Real Presence in this Holy Meal are welcome to commune with us at this Altar. A fuller explanation of what Lutherans believe concerning Holy Communion may be found on page one of this worship folder.

Holy Communion is distributed to the congregation at the chancel rail. Please follow the direction of the ushers to make your way to the Altar. You may kneel or stand as you feel comfortable. The Sacrament is distributed in the following manner...Please extend your hand to the assistant to receive the Body of Christ. Christ's Blood may be received in one of two ways, using that which you feel most comfortable: 1) individual cups containing wine and white grape juice will be offered by the Pastor, or 2) drinking from the chalice. Children and those not wishing to receive the Sacrament are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.





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#### **NOTES AND NEWS**

LARGE PRINT HYMNALS ... Copies of the Lutheran Service Book in Large Print are available for use during worship for those who may have need of them. You may find them on the literature table at the rear of the sanctuary, and please return them there following the service.

THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT ... is known by the Latin name of Laetare, meaning "Rejoice". This name comes from the opening word of the historic Introit of the Day which quotes Isaiah 66:10: "Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her." And this day marks what is also known as "Mid-Lent Sunday", noting that we are around the halfway point of our 40-day Lenten observance. For this reason, this Sunday is often also given the title of "Refreshment Sunday": a moment in the midst of the rigorous repentance and fasting of the season to be refreshed by the joy found in God's gifts through which He provides for our needs of body and soul. This idea is especially pointed out to us in the Collect of the Day, as well as in the day's historic Gospel reading of Jesus' feeding of the 5,000 and in our current Gospel of the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The traditional liturgical color of the day is Rose: using the Lenten Season's penitential color of violet and "lightening" it with the white of the coming Easter festival, symbolic of the joy that is soon to come for faithful Christian hearts. Also, in the United Kingdom, Ireland, and some countries in the British Commonwealth, today is observed as "Mothering Sunday", the equivalent of our own "Mother's Day". This recalls the words of the historic Epistle for the day from Galatians 4, which speaks of "Jerusalem, our mother". And as Christians remember the Church as the mother who birthed us into the life of faith in Holy Baptism, we are also called to remember with love the mothers who birthed us into life in this world.

MIDWEEK LENTEN SERVICES ... We continue our Midweek Lenten Services in the remaining Wednesdays of this Lenten Season (April 2 & 9). Our weekly services will use a spoken order of the Office of Vespers with Sermon. The theme of this year's Lenten preaching is "Jesus—Servant, Savior, Friend", which is also the theme of our Lenten Devotional. A full schedule of this year's Lenten Worship can be found by visiting our church website: tlcmr.org.

LENTEN SUPPERS ... Also, we are again offering a light meal before the Lenten Services for the convenience of those who are coming directly from work and for all those who would like to share in a time of food and fellowship together. The meals will begin at 6:00 PM. Questions about the suppers can be made to Carole Dingess.




General Offerings needed to meet the 2025 budget: \$11,951
